

THE BEAUMONTS OF DARTON HALL

As reported in the March edition of the magazine, the Beaumonts purchased

Darton Hall in 1617. (Previously named *Hill House*) As the Beaumont family prospered in the mid/late eighteenth century the name *Darton Hall* was more in keeping with their new found status. Their wealth was very much in evidence in 1688 when William Beaumont completed a



settlement transferring ownership of the Darton estate to his recently married son George and settling it on him and the children of the marriage. A fascinating arrangement!

- i) William transferred the whole estate, lock, stock and barrel to his son George
- William then instructed George to lease Darton back to him for life. (George carried on living at Chapelthorpe near Wakefield, another Beaumont residence.)
- iii) William then paid George £100 a year rental for what was his own property!
- iv) But William's best intensions were not realised because George died before his father. (George d. 1712 and William d. 1713. They are both buried with their wives in the Beaumont Chapel, recorded on the cast iron memorial slabs.)

The marriage settlement (indenture) makes interesting reading. We are indebted to Edward Beaumont and his wife Caroline for the transcript. It must have been difficult to read.

Edward records that '*This* (the indenture) is written on two sheets of paper just over 12 inches wide and about 15 inches deep. They are fixed together at the bottom with a seal on a tag. The seal appears to have a device of a bird with something in its beak (olive branch?) on it. The paper has been folded into eight in the past and on the back sheet it says 'Son Geo Beaumont's lease to me during my life at100 Li per an.' Someone has then written in pencil the date of 20 December 1688 and underneath the reference DDPF 143/1. (That is the former Nottinghamshire Archive's classification.)'

Edward is anxious that this historical document is available for research :-*`This document in particular struck me that you and people you know in* Darton may be interested in it. It contains lots of local Darton field and place names, and who knows, someone might know exactly which places the names belong to.'

INDENTURE DATED 1688

This indenture made ye 20th day of December in the Fourth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord James the Second by the Grace of God of England, Scotland, France and Ireland Defender of the Faith Anno Domini 1688.


Between George Beaumont of Darton in the county of York. Yeoman of the one part and William Beaumont of Darton in the county aforesaid Yeoman of the other part.to farm, let unto the said William Beaumont his executors, administrators, and assigns, all the capital messuage called Hill House (Darton Hall) wherein the said William Beaumont doth now inhabit, together with all the houses, edifices, barns, stables, backsides, orchards, gardens, crofts, closes of land, woods, woody grounds hereafter and particularly named The Croft under the House, The Close on the west side, The Barn, The Footgate, The Hackins, The Broadroyds, The Clough Inge, The Appletree Flatt, The Broad Inge, The Little Inge, The Large Inge next The Water, The Cow Close, The Black Butts, The Coney Garth, The Carriage Gate, Close Kirk Inge, The Maggroyde, The Bargh Watersides, once divided into four closes, The Garner Bight, The Upper and Nether Fauckknowle Hills, thirteen arable lands in Far Field, the arable lands in the Church Field, one barn bought of John Birkheadand all the tithes of corn and grain and wool and lamb in the Constablery of Darton....and all the messuages, lands, tithes, and farm houses, buildings, cottages, and lands with the appurtenances in the several possessions or buildings of Thomas Webster. Betrice Newton. Thomas Hutchinson. Nathaniel Carr and Jane Linton,...... which the said William Beaumont settled and conveyed unto the abovesaid George Beaumont.....

George's son (also named George) inherited Darton on his father's death in 1712

Edward states that '*I have copies and transcripts of documents I am willing to share with Darton people.*' Likewise if anyone can identify any of the field names or the names of individuals etc in the 1688 document please get in touch,- Edward would welcome any information

The 1688 document is number 17/001 in Edward's catalogue in West Yorks Archives (Wakefield) I also have a copy if anyone wants to read or access the whole indenture.
